



Headline outcome figures for Greyfriars 2023

Year 1 Phonics 61% (2022 = 47%)

34 children in Yr 1. 33 took the assessment 1 was disapplied.

20 of the 33 achieved the pass mark of 32 = 61%

Of the remaining 13, 2 were near misses = 6%

Therefore, passes would be 67%

Of the remaining 13:

1 selective mute

1 Hearing impediment

1 new to the country (little English)

3 SEN

If these 6 were not part of the assessments, then scores would be 74%

In addition, these yr 1 pupils had a EYFS GLD of 22 with a EYFS Literacy of 38. Whilst 61% is below national this cohort have made good progress.

Year 2 Phonic retake 50%

14 Children took the assessment.

7 passed = 50%

The remaining 7, 4 are EAL one is brand new to the country. The other 3 are behaviour (1 has been offered a place at FEN Rivers)

Outcomes for Yr 2 are below previous trajectory predictions.

A number of factors influence these outcomes.



The attainment of this cohort in previous years was not tracked in EYFS due to the COVID years. However, their phonics in Yr 1 was well below national at 47%. There was also a declining trend in the school outcomes from 2019 to 2022. In addition, this cohort has been housed in the mobile which has had a large amount of disruption due to behaviour issues impacting on learning. The teacher was also new to Yr 2. We also had a change of part time teaching staff throughout the year. The main teacher, in her predictions, was using a best fit model to assess attainment, however, through internal and external moderation (UET & NCC) a tighter consistent model of attainment was used. Many of the working towards are close to expected standard and given another term would be at expected. This being the case we would be seeing mid 60% for attainment. I believe that the current outcomes are a truer reflection of attainment in year 2.

Year 4 Multiplication assessment

There is no pass mark for Yr 4 Multiplication assessment.

25 out of 25 = 7 pupils = 23%

20 to 24 = 9 pupils = 30%

Therefore, pupils with 20 or more = 53%

15 to 19 = 7 pupils = 23%

10 or less = 7 pupils = 23%
