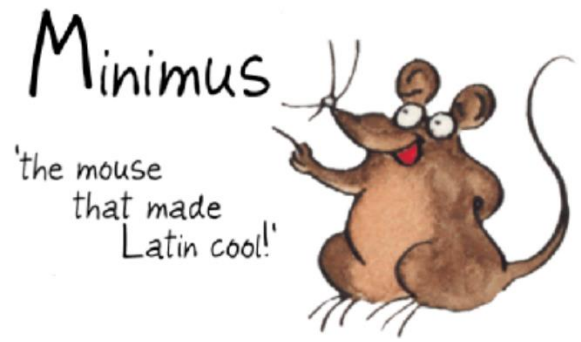

- The letter v in Latin makes the same sound as the letter w in English.
