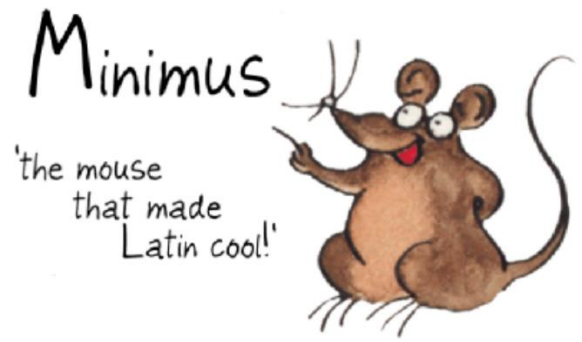

## Minimus Chapter 11



### Subject or object?

Words can do different jobs in a sentence.  
 The person/thing doing the verb is called the **subject** of the sentence.  
 The person/thing having the action done to them is called the **object** of the sentence.

### Example

Remember that the **verb** is the action word in the sentence.

<i>subject</i>	<i>verb</i>	<i>object</i>
Candidus	writes	a letter.

In Latin, we can identify which person/thing is the object of a sentence by looking at the word ending – it often changes to “m”.

epistula – subject  
 epistulam - object
